Data Controller

The Data Controller, pursuant to the Law, is Mario Cassina. (Kottbusser Damm 6, Berlin 10967, Germany, Tax number: 14/249/02298, contactable at the following email address: cassinamario@gmail.com, in the person of its legal representative pro tempore.)

Cassina Mario, in his capacity as Data Controller of your personal data, pursuant to and for the purposes of EU Regulation 2016/679, hereinafter referred to as the “GDPR”, hereby informs you that the aforementioned regulation provides for the protection of data subjects with regard to the processing of personal data and that such processing will be carried out in accordance with the principles of fairness, lawfulness, transparency, and protection of your privacy and rights.

Your personal data will be processed in accordance with the legislative provisions of the aforementioned regulation and the confidentiality obligations provided therein.

Purposes, Legal Basis, and Retention Periods

Your data will be used for the following purposes:

Necessary browsing data:

The IT systems and software procedures used to operate this website acquire, during their normal operation, certain personal data whose transmission is implicit in the use of Internet communication protocols.

This category of data includes the IP addresses or domain names of the computers and terminals used by users, the URI/URL addresses (Uniform Resource Identifier/Locator) of the requested resources, the time of the request, the method used to submit the request to the server, the size of the file received in response, the numerical code indicating the status of the response provided by the server, such as successful, error, etc., and other parameters relating to the user’s operating system and IT environment.

Such data, which is necessary for the use of web services, is processed for the purpose of monitoring the correct functioning of the services offered.

Browsing data and technical data will be processed and stored for the time strictly necessary to ensure the correct functioning of the website, the security of the systems, the provision of the requested services, and compliance with any legal obligations or requests from the competent authorities.

More specific retention periods, where applicable, are indicated in detail in the Cookie Policy.

Statistical browsing data and cookies:

Subject to the user's consent, the website may use cookies and similar technologies to obtain statistical information on the use of the services, such as the most visited pages, the number of visitors by time slot or day, and the geographical areas of origin. For further details on the types of cookies used, their purposes, and the methods for managing consent, please refer to the Cookie Policy available in the footer of the website.

Personal data voluntarily provided by the user:

Personal data provided by completing the forms available on the website will be processed for the purposes indicated below.

Contact and information requests:

Personal data provided by the user, such as name, surname, email address, telephone number, and company of affiliation, will be processed exclusively in order to respond to the request for information submitted by the data subject. Such data will be retained for the time strictly necessary to provide the requested service.

Categories of Recipients of the Data Being Processed

Your data will be processed only by personnel expressly authorised by the Data Controller and, in particular, by the following categories of authorised personnel:

Internal operators responsible for managing the web portal.

Any technical personnel appointed to examine and respond to information requests submitted by the user.

Communication

Your data may be communicated, for the proper management of the relationship, to external parties duly appointed as Data Processors, including web service providers responsible for the management and maintenance of the platform.

Disclosure

Your personal data will not be disclosed in any way.

Transfer of Data to Third Countries

Your personal data may also be transferred, limited to the purposes indicated above, to the following countries:

- EU countries;
- United States.

Should it become necessary to transfer the personal data of data subjects to countries located outside the EEA, this will take place in compliance with the limits and conditions set out in Articles 44 et seq. of EU Regulation 2016/679.

Processing Methods

The processing of Personal Data indicated above will be carried out by the Data Controller using automated or manual methods.

Rights of the Data Subject — EU Regulation 2016/679: Articles 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22

The data subject has the right to obtain confirmation as to whether or not personal data concerning them exists, even if not yet recorded, to receive such data in an intelligible form, and to lodge a complaint with the Supervisory Authority.

The data subject has the right to obtain information on:

the origin of the personal data;

the purposes and methods of processing;

the logic applied in the event of processing carried out with the aid of electronic tools;

the identification details of the Data Controller, Data Processors, and the representative designated pursuant to Article 5, paragraph 2;

the subjects or categories of subjects to whom the personal data may be communicated or who may become aware of it in their capacity as designated representative in the territory of the State, Data Processors, or persons in charge of processing.

The data subject has the right to obtain:

the updating, rectification, or, where they have an interest, integration of the data;

the erasure, anonymisation, or blocking of data processed unlawfully, including data whose retention is not necessary in relation to the purposes for which it was collected or subsequently processed;

certification that the operations referred to in letters a) and b) have been notified, also as regards their content, to those to whom the data has been communicated or disclosed, unless this requirement proves impossible or involves a manifestly disproportionate effort compared with the protected right;

data portability.

The data subject has the right to object, in whole or in part:

on legitimate grounds, to the processing of personal data concerning them, even if relevant to the purpose for which it was collected;

to the processing of personal data concerning them for the purpose of sending advertising material or direct sales communications, or for carrying out market research or commercial communications.
